## Terms and Conditions:

1. All attendees are expected to be at Lincoln University, Gate 1, bus stop at 8.00am on 14 April, 2020 to catch the bus to Koukourarata for a 10am pōwhiri. The bus will be leaving at 8:30am sharp.
2. Please note: **this is not a holiday camp**. It is a kaupapa driven, marae based wānaka and full participation, including in the kitchen, is expected. If you are not prepared to participate fully, this is not the Wānaka for you.
3. By attending this Wānaka, **you are expected to continue undertaking mahika kai activities** of your choice at home or in your community as a contribution and service to your whānau, hapū or iwi.
4. **On the week of 12-15 July 2021, the Mahika Kai Conference** will be held at the Lincoln Event Centre, we will be calling on attendees of this Wānaka to present a kaupapa in the Taiohi stream of the Conference. By attending this Wānaka, you acknowledge that **you will be invited to attend and/or present** at this Conference.
5. The Taiohi Mahika Kai Wānaka will **be held at Tūtehuarewa Marae at Koukourarata** (Port Levy). Accommodation will be provided on the marae. Those who attend will need to provide a sleeping bag or blanket for bedding. Linen and pillows will be provided.
6. Wherever possible, vegetarian, gluten free, dairy free options will be provided. Please note however, that **this Wānaka is an indigenous hui being held at a Marae and therefore Marae catering will be provided**. If you are unsure whether this will meet your strict requirements, we recommend you bring food that is more suitable to you ie gluten free bread.
7. By signing the form, **you agree to the use of photography, audio and video** throughout the Taiohi Mahika Kai Wānaka.
8. The Taiohi Mahika Kai Wānaka **will also include physical activity such as gardening, collecting shellfish, riparian planting, digging and other mahika kai activities**. By signing the form you acknowledge that although all health and safety precautions will be undertaken and adhered to, that the Taiohi who attend the Wānaka will also exercise common sense, adhere to instructions, comply with health and safety requirements and be respectful to the environment and all those around them.
9. **Should Taiohi not comply with instructions** from the facilitators and cause health and safety issues, or exhibit behavior deemed disrespectful by the facilitators, **the Taiohi will be removed from the Wānaka** and returned home and incur all costs to do so by reimbursable invoice.
10. **The Taiohi is able to swim unaided for a minimum of 25 metres**, is confident in the water and is prepared to engage in mahika kai activities in and around the seaside. This Wānaka will not require Taiohi to dive for seafood or be in water that is over their heads while undertaking mahika kai activities.
11. **Appropriate use of cellphones, Ipads and laptops is expected**. Please note that there is neither cellphone reception and if you do have access to wifi, continuous inattention or distraction during the Wānaka will be considered disrespectful and you may be asked to leave. However, there are parts of Port Levy that have cellphone reception which Taiohi will be able to access at the conclusion of each day during break times.

### List of clothing and equipment Taiohi are required to bring:

- Sleeping bag or blanket.
- Wet weather jacket.
- Appropriate swimming gear for harvesting shallow kaimoana.
- Clothing for the four days including warm clothing (please note there is no accessible laundry or laundromat in Port Levy).
- Towel x 2.
- Gumboots.
- 4 pairs of socks
- Antihistamine if you suffer from allergies.
- Toiletries.
